***FREE Student Opportunity: “Phoenix: A Promise of Dignity”
Credit Recovery Program***

Diversified Community Schools (DCS) is pleased to announce an additional “Credit Recovery Program” option which has been provided through the American Recovery Reinvestment Act (ARRA) stimulus funds. MPS students can be referred to this program **FREE** of charge!

The Credit Recovery Program RFP contract was awarded to Lad Lake Synergy and is named **“Phoenix: A Promise of Dignity.”** The Phoenix program has 200 available seats and is an after-school/Saturday program which provides up to 4-hours per day. The current student application period is for this Spring Semester ONLY. School leaders and guidance counselors may refer students to the program and must provide the Intake Referral Form. The Phoenix program will use the transfer school model by continuing enrollment in the student’s current school and cross-enrolling the student to the Phoenix program.

The **“Phoenix: A Promise of Dignity”** program targets (*also attached*): 1) freshman who failed to earn all credits during the Fall Semester; 2) seniors at-risk of not graduating; 3) over-aged under credited students working to qualify for specialized programs. The credit recovery offerings include **Math, English, Science, Physical Education and Career Awareness.**
