The tickets were only 50 cents each and if you didn't have the money, a lot of the games were free.

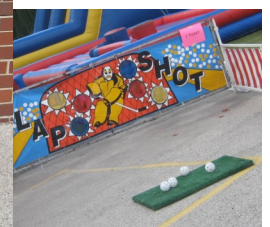
Believe it or not, in the front they placed some inflatable obsta-

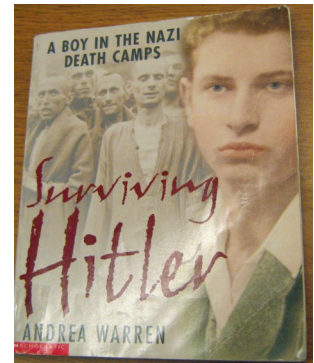
tries to survive.
