From the Desk of the Principal...

What You Can Do at Home to Help Your Child Succeed at School? Research shows that children are more likely to succeed in school when parents or caregivers take an active part in their education. A good education is important for finding a good job and having a good future. It makes sense to help your child do well at school. Most parents want to get more involved in their child's education, but may not be sure how to begin. Remember, you don't have to know how to do the homework to help your child succeed in school.

A positive attitude about school is perhaps the most important gift you can give your child. Be careful not to pass on negative attitudes about school that may be a part of your own past experience. Giving children the idea that school is too difficult, that teachers are unfair, or that school isn't important will discourage them from doing well. Instead, talk about your friends from school, your favorite teachers or your best subject. Talk to your child about the future and plans for high school, technical school or college. Tell your child that you wish them success in school.

Share your ideas about the importance of education with your child. Talk about ties between what your child is learning today and how that knowledge might be used in the future. Begin to talk about possible education goals for your child. If you begin to think about goals, your child will too. A short-term goal may be finishing a writing assignment by Sunday night. A long-term goal could be attending a trade school, the local community college or a university after high school.

Communicate with the school and find out what to expect. Each of our grade levels have a minimum daily homework. You should be well informed about the school's policies and academic standards for your child. The Parent Handbook has information pertinent to the school's educational program. Communicate with your child's teacher to find out what the expectations are for your child.

Talk to your child about what they are learning at school. From a kindergartner to a high school senior, it's important to ask students about their school subjects. Ask open-ended questions about their class work —questions that can't be answered with a "yes" or "no." Share any knowledge you have, and if you are curious, read the textbook!

Help your child get organized to work on educational assignments at home. Establish a good work environment at home. Create a study area or corner. You can start this as early as first grade, and it becomes more important as school work is assigned. Have a table and chair in a quiet place away from the TV, perhaps in the corner of a bedroom. Add a lamp, if needed. Add a box for books and supplies. Make a special trip to the store to buy supplies such as paper, pencils, and colored pens. As your child gets older, add a clock. Help keep this area tidy and ready for use.

You don't have to have all the answers, just being a good listener will help. Please refer to Honey Creek's Parent Handbook Section 8, Page 3 through 6 for details about our Homework Policy.

READING IS FUNDAMENTAL

JUST A REMINDER

SCORE 4 REWARD

Students will be deciding on the recognition event for meeting the Score 4 criteria.

To earn this, students must earn four points. A point is earned by doing the following:

1 point = No more than two excused absences or no more than three times tardy.

1 point = Good Behavior
No 72 cards, Discipline Referrals or In House Suspensions

1 point = Homework- Nightly homework completed and handed in (Kdg students when assigned)

1 point = Teacher recommendation

4 Points Total

The point program will begin **Feb. 1st for CP2-5 & Feb. 15th for K5 & CP1 students** and continue

through **March 12, 2012.**

Parents and students will be notified by March 16th if their child has earned the 4 points to be eligible to attend the recognition activities. Parents can help their child earn points by sending them to school, checking to see if they have their homework done, and reminding them to behave on the bus and in school.

INTERNET SAFETY

Students at Honey Creek are using their "Net Smarts"! There are 4 internet safety websites linked to our school library catalog page. Students can log-in to the Honey Creek Library catalog (Destiny) from home or at school and find the links on the home page. Our goal is to extend safety awareness of our children to prevent victimization and increase self-confidence whenever they go online. These goals include how to:

- * enhance the ability of children to recognize dangers on the Internet
- * enhance the ability of children to understand that people they first "meet" on the Internet should never be considered their friend
- * encourage children to report victimization to a trusted adult

- * support and enhance community education efforts
- * increase communication between adults and children about online safety

They have been learning about how to stay safe while browsing the web.

Three basic rules for online safety are:

1. I will tell an adult I trust if anything makes me feel scared, uncomfortable, or confused.
2. I will ask my parent or guardian before sharing my personal information.
3. I won't meet in person with anyone I have first "met" online.

We all work very hard each day to prepare our children for success. All of the subject matter we cover and the things you teach at home are necessary to form a strong base of knowledge for a job and for life. One of the most sought after traits in today's job market is a good work ethic and the ability to be at work and on time each day. Here's where we really need your help. Honey Creek has managed to keep its attendance to an average of 96%. We still have children who are not attending school on a regular basis. We have seen more children who are dropped off at school 10 to 20 minutes late every day. Although we know occasionally being late is unavoidable, regular tardiness sends a silent message that the first half of school is not important. Teachers are ready to teach at 7:45 am. Please make every effort to have your children at school and ready to learn at 7:45. We appreciate all those that are taking the responsibility of making sure your children are in school everyday and have the needed supplies so they can actively participate in the learning process. The staff is thankful for every parent/guardian or grandparent who is taking the time to make sure that children have completed homework assignments every evening. We know this helps children do better in school and have a better chance of having a successful future.

PARENTS: HELP KIDS BE MORE RESPONSIBLE

Tired of pestering your kids to do homework or chores? "Resolve in your own mind that you're just not going to engage in the battle," says Jamie Woolf, author of the book and blog *Mom-in-Chief*. One tactic: Set consequences ahead of time and follow through.

Four more strategies:

Make kids take charge. Woolf wakes her kids each morning, but getting ready for school is up to them. If they're late, they don't get a note from Mom excusing them.

Teach Respect. Before you make a phone call, tell your kids how long you'll be on the phone and come up with a hand signal to let them know when their volume or pestering is interrupting you. "This is teaching respect and courtesy," Woolf says.

Set Boundaries. Explain the purpose of trips to the store: "Say, 'this is not a time when I'm going to buy anything we don't need, so don't talk to me about buying things.'"

Get a System. Don't constantly remind your kids to practice an instrument or get ready for ballet class. "Make practice charts that they can decorate with markers and stickers to record their progress," Woolf says.

MAGAZINE FUNDRAISER PROJECT

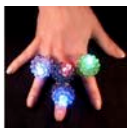

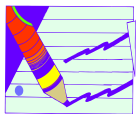

Honey Creek School's 2011-2012 Fall Parent Survey Responses

The Honey Creek (HC) Staff and I greatly appreciate parents' input, which certainly helps direct our efforts to strengthen the educational program. We are privileged to serve the children and families of Honey Creek School. The Fall Parent Satisfaction Surveys have come back with an overwhelming majority of positive comments. More than 95% of the surveys returned indicated satisfaction with the educational programming and the staff. Below are HC's responses to concerns and positive comments are also included:

Statement: Communication

Response: We communicate to parents via the classroom newsletters, school Gopher Tales, Red Communication folders, teachers' notes, phone calls, and Alert Now auto messaging.

Statement: Building upkeep

Response: Honey Creek School was constructed in 1954. We make every effort to keep the facility safe, clean, and functional and attend to repairs with a sense of urgency. Our engineering crew works diligently to make sure our students' needs are taken care of.

Statement: Lunch

Response: Lunch and recess are scheduled as best as we can. Our days are jam packed with education. The youngest children do have 45 minutes to finish their lunch. We want children to socialize during their lunch and they do. We do ask that the children eat quietly for the last five minutes of their lunch for. We want to be sure that the children are adequately nourished for the afternoon.

Statement: Evening events

Response: We host our programs during the day so that all of our children have the opportunity to participate and experience the enrichment.

Statement: School Climate – Safety, Positive Behaviors

Responses: We are in our second year of sharing transportation. When matters pertaining to students' safety are brought to our attention, we attend to them with an extreme sense of urgency. We do ask that students report matters of concern to the bus driver and to the school staff so that we are able to intervene on their behalf. This is our first year of implementing the Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) formally – Be Responsible, Be Respectful, and Be Safe. We continue to emphasize positive behaviors and recognize students' efforts frequently. The staff works diligently with the students to explain what each of those behaviors mean and what it should look like.

Statement: Transportation for after school programs

Response: We are unable to offer transportation for after school programs because of budget constraints.

Some positive comments:

- Great job, love the weekly updates about what my child is learning.
- The school really tries to help students individually.
- The teachers are excellent and I like that staff know the children's names. I would recommend Honey Creek to other families. My daughter loves this school and learning.
- I am so happy I chose this school to send my children to. The Principal is amazing.
- I am satisfied with the academic program at Honey Creek. I would like to say thank you to the staff for the hard work and dedication.
- Honey Creek is an excellent school for our son. We see continuous advancements in his academics and manners.
- Thank you Honey Creek for making my boys' education and safety a top priority.
- We are thankful for the library and the teachers' willingness to teach music, art and PE when there is a shortage. We appreciate the AR program because it challenges our son. The school is safe and the staff cares about the students.
