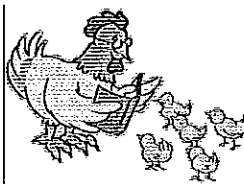

## BREAKFAST/LUNCH APPLICATIONS

Each school year every MPS household must re-apply for free/reduced lunch. It takes up to 1 week to be approved by doing the application online at [www.sns.milwaukee.k12.wi.us](http://www.sns.milwaukee.k12.wi.us) or up 2 weeks by filling out a paper application which can be obtained here at WCLL or at Central Office. Please remember that your child must either pay for breakfast/lunch or bring their own until they are approved. One application is required per family. **You must reapply every year.** You must provide either a bag lunch or have your child bring lunch money to school. Meal prices are as follows:

### Breakfast:

- Elementary paid: \$0.75
- Secondary paid: \$0.80
- Reduced: \$0.30
- Additional Milk \$0.35

### Lunch:

- Elementary paid: \$1.75
- Secondary paid: \$2.00
- Reduced: \$0.40
- Student Milk: \$0.35
